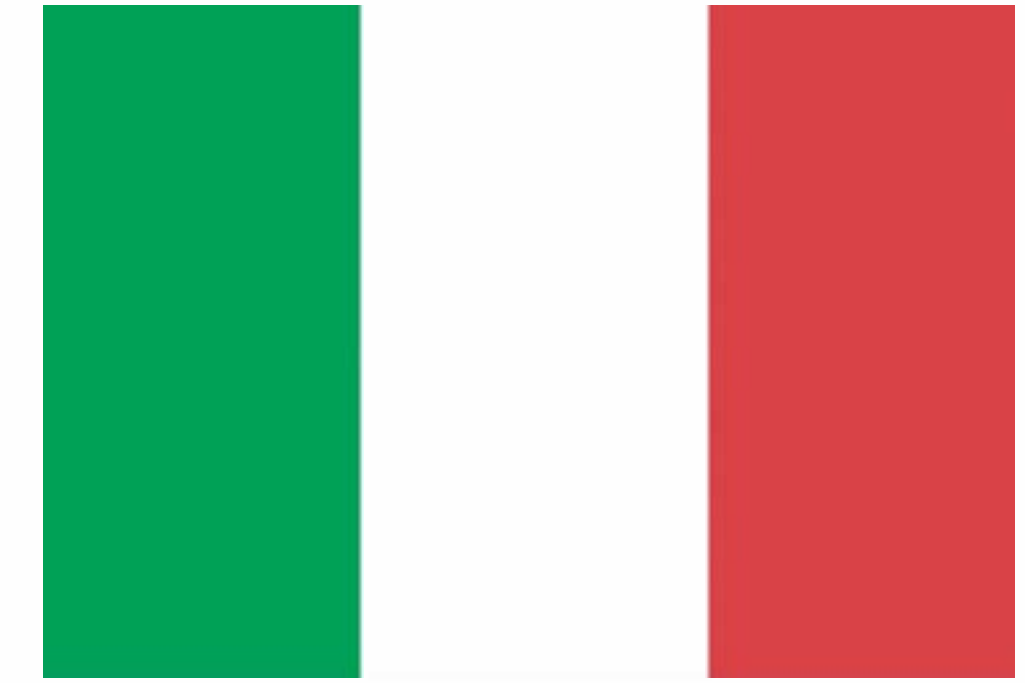
UGANDA

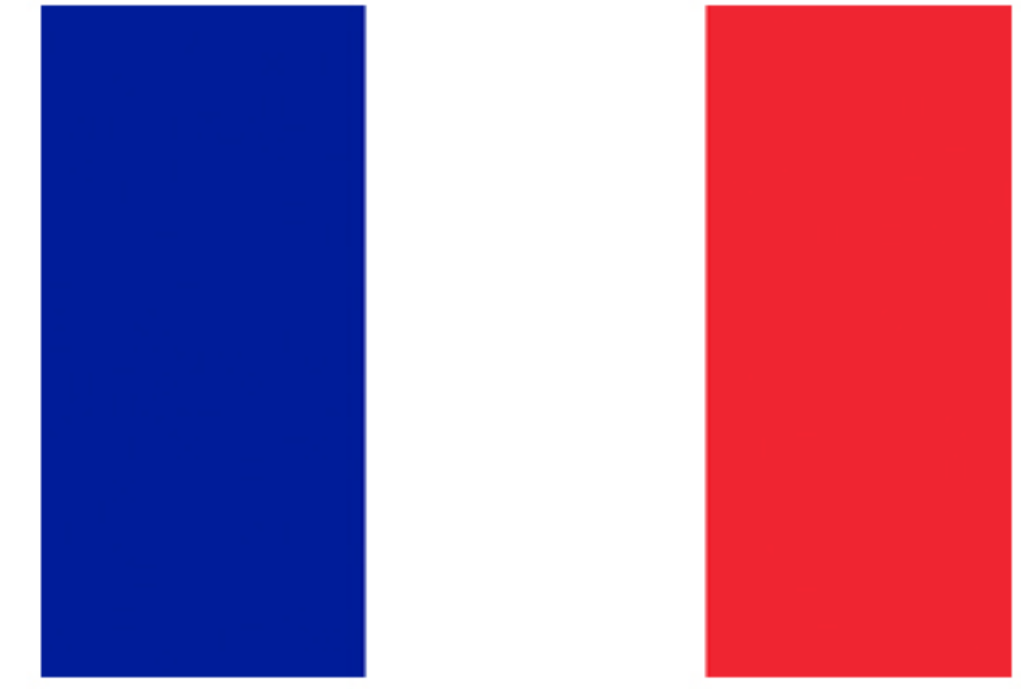
LIBERIA

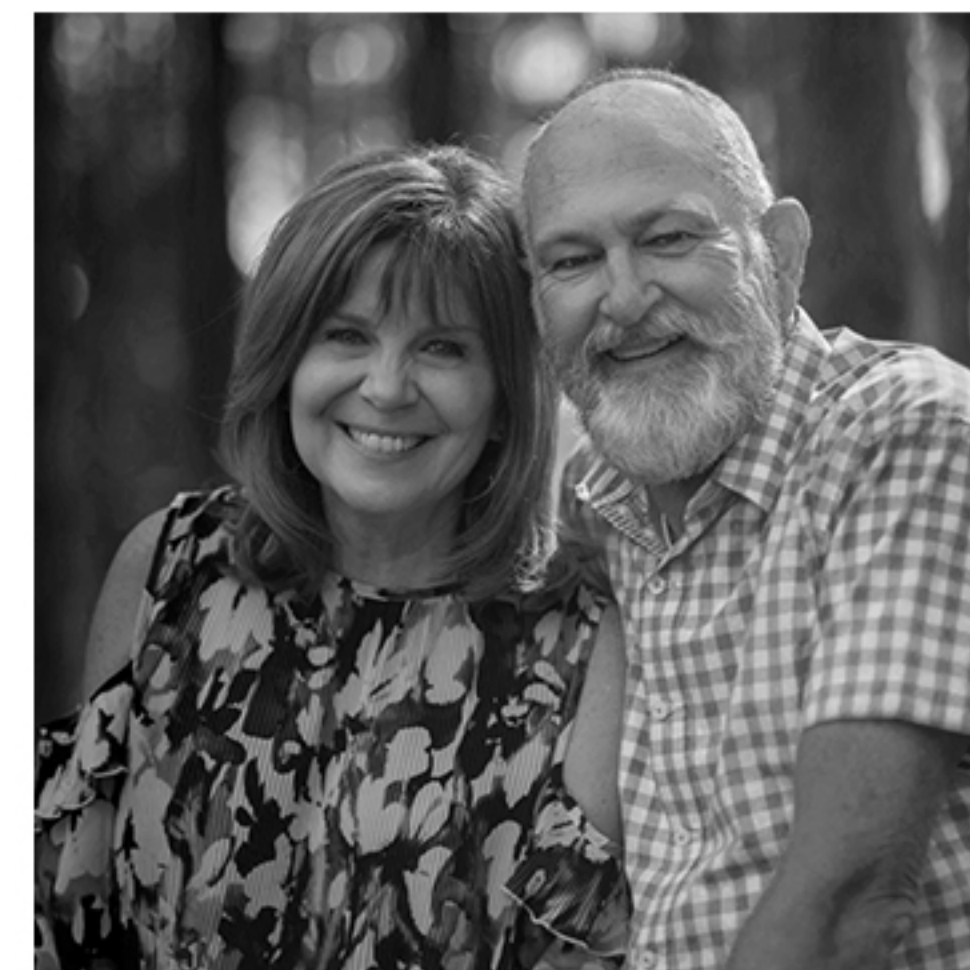
KENYA

ERDO is the humanitarian agency of the PAOC. As one of Canada's top charities* for program effectiveness and financial management, ERDO focusses on three areas of work: crisis response, community development and child sponsorship (ChildCARE Plus). These programs are carried out in partnership with PAOC global workers and the local church.

ERDO's Christ-centred work is active in 40 countries. Programs include creating clean water sources and empowering men and women with microfinance loans and vocational training. Child sponsorship educates both boys and girls, enabling them greater opportunities to earn a future income, and in many cases, allowing them to hear the Gospel. ERDO's food programs are often matched by the Canadian Government through membership in the Canadian Foodgrains Bank.

BEST PRACTICES FOR CHURCHES

Care:

Many Global & Mission Canada Workers are only connected to a church through the lead pastor relationship. If you have multiple Workers that you support, connecting them to one of your small groups is a great way for extra Care (Prayer requests, Birthday's, Christmas gifts) to happen through the congregation and not just through you.

Communication:

Churches typically receive newsletters or emails from their Global & Mission Canada Workers providing updates, they love to hear what's happening in your church too! Put them on your church email list and include them in what the Lord is doing among your community. It helps them to feel that they are part of your church and part of a TWO-WAY relationship. You might be surprised how a Worker will help pray for you or give ideas & resources to what God has laid on your heart to do here.

Commitment:

Each year the church should initiate communication with Workers you support to either affirm and update the support amount or to let them know (as soon as possible) if there will be any change in support. *Make this part of your annual budget procedure.* Look to increase support at least with inflation each year to keep your faith growing too.

Committee:

There is much creativity, care, fundraising support and encouragement that is often lost because the pastor does all of this alone. A better way for everyone is to find capable, generous, caring people who can help carry the burden of vision and planning. Unleash them in alignment with your church vision and strategy. Let them dream and plan for this important aspect of your church.

Contact:

Keep any Global & Mission Canada Workers you support visible to your congregation all year round. Have them visit in person when they are home, use Zoom calls, send a team (big or small) on a mission's trip to connect. Showcase them somewhere in a main area of the church. If you have multiple Workers, take turns featuring them monthly in your bulletin, emails or social media with updates/prayer needs.

ADDITIONAL IDEAS

Some churches assist GW's on home assignment by providing a vehicle or lodging. These are two main concerns for any GW returning to Canada. Any way your church can help with logistical details and/or their costs is absolute GOLD to a GW looking to come home for a few months.

Helping a GW with extra expenses that have occurred from funerals or emergencies is a very caring and practical way to support them when they need care the most.

If a GW you partner with is home during conference or another significant District or National event, consider helping them with the costs to attend so that they too can feel part of the fellowship.

At the end of the year, some churches choose to give an extra gift to a GW as part of any overage as a surprise blessing of the Lord's goodness. Some churches designate funds like that for GW's in need by contacting the District or the International Missions office to know where best to direct those additional funds for immediate impact.

If your congregation is planning a missions' trip, ensure that the board has officially authorized the trip and recorded that in their board minutes. This ensures that any funding from donations or resources from the church is correctly designated to an approved project.
